To begin with, the name *Ariel* refers to three different things: Sylvia Plath's own horse, which she loved to ride; the androgynous sprite from Shakespeare's play *The Tempest*; and Jerusalem, which was also called *Ariel* in the Old Testament. Critics who discuss Shakespeare's *Ariel* tend to read Plath's poem as an exploration of poetic creativity and process.
