### **Death, Intermediate State and Rebirth / By the 14th Dalai Lama**

The intermediate state, or bardo, is so called because it is the state between death and the next rebirth. Beings who wander in this state are known as 'bardo beings'. The easiest way to gain conviction of the existence of the bardo is by considering the analogy of the dream state, which closely resembles the bardo.

### **Understanding the Intermediate State | Death and Dying**

In some schools of Buddhism, bardo (Classical Tibetan: བར་དོ་ Wylie: bar do), antarabhāv ( ), or chūu (Japanese: 中陰) is an intermediate, transitional, or liminal state between death and rebirth. It is a concept which arose soon after the Buddha's passing, with a number of earlier Buddhist groups accepting the existence of such an intermediate state, while other schools rejected it.

Often, the word 'bardo' is used simply to denote the intermediate state between death and rebirth; however, bardo also has the wider meaning of a transitional state. The painful bardo of dying begins with the onset of a terminal disease or condition that ends in death. It is called 'painful' because it hurts to let go.

If a place of birth appropriate to one's predispositions is not found, a small death occurs after seven days, and one is reborn into another intermediate state. This can occur at most six times, with the result that the longest period spent in the intermediate state is forty-nine days.
