Fyodor Dostoevsky (1821-1881) is a Russian novelist whose works anticipate existential psychoanalysis. Several biographical points should be briefly mentioned. Both parents died before Dostoevsky graduated from a military engineering academy in St. Petersburg.

Dostoevsky's *Crime and Punishment* refashioned the idea of what a novel could be. By the 1860s Dostoevsky had been orphaned, imprisoned, conscripted and widowed. Lumbered with debts and immersed in the nihilism of St Petersburg, he set about developing the "psychological account of a crime".

In 1869, Dostoevsky conceived the idea of a 'pamphlet novel' directed against the radicals. He focused on the group organized by young agitator Sergey Nechayev, particularly their murder of a former comrade—Ivan Ivanov—at the Petrovskaya Agricultural Academy in Moscow.
