These rules were created as a result of growing dissatisfaction among shippers and their insurers due to arbitrary restrictions imposed by carriers to limit their liability ...

In addition, the 1979 INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION ON MARITIME SEARCH AND RESCUE (SAR CONVENTION)obliges State Parties to ‘... ensure that assistance [is] provided to any person in distress at sea ... regardless of the nationality or status of such a person or the circumstances in which that person is found’ (Chapter 2.1.10) and to ‘... provide for their initial medical or other needs, and deliver them to a place of safety’ (Chapter 1.3.2).

(vi) The Convention on Limitation of Liability for Maritime Claims, 1976. This Convention has replaced International Convention relating to the Limitation of Liability of owners of seagoing ships, 1957. It came into force from 1 st December, 1986. The provisions of 1957 Convention have already been incorporated in the M. S. Act, 1958.
