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Star Literacy Test Scores And

The Scaled Score (SS) is the actual score that a student received on the Star Early Literacy assessment. It is calculated based upon the difficulty of the questions and the number of correct responses. It ranges from 300-900; this scale was chosen so that the range of Scaled Scores is 100 times the age range for which Star Early Literacy was designed—from about 3-9.

STAR Early Literacy - Scaled Score

Star Early Literacy scaled scores range from 300 to 900 and relate directly to the literacy classifications. Literacy classifications are the stages of literacy development measured in Star Early Literacy and associated with scaled scores: Emergent Reader (300-674), Transitional Reader (675-774), and Probable Reader (775-900).

Star Early Literacy measures both early literacy and early numeracy in a single assessment, providing reliable and valid data about students’ phonological awareness, phonics, word recognition, fluency (including estimated oral reading fluency), and vocabulary as well as early number recognition, counting, and more.

Kindergarten students must demonstrate a score of at least 500 on the Star Early Literacy assessment to be considered “ready for kindergarten.” The 500 scale score was determined as a part of the State Board rulemaking process.

Scaled Scores in STAR Early Literacy range from 300 to 900 and span the grades Pre-K through 3. Lisa obtained a Scaled Score of 475. Scaled Scores relate to three developmental stages: Emergent Reader (300 - 674), Transitional Reader (675-774), and Probable Reader (775 - 900). A Scaled Score of 475 means that Lisa is at the Emergent Reader stage.

Questions and Answers

STAR Early Literacy is designed for students in the early stages of literacy development. These students are usually in pre-kindergarten through third grade, but students in any grade, such as special education students or English language learners, can take the test. STAR Reading and STAR Math are designed for students in grades 1 through 12.

Getting the Most out of STAR Assessments

STAR Early Literacy uses a scale range of 0-900. This score can be used to compare students to each other, as well as themselves, over time. Early Emergent Reader:Scaled score of 300-487. Student has a beginning understanding that printed text has meaning.

A scaled score (SS) is the student’s score on the assessment. It is used to report performance for all students on a consistent scale. To make the results of all tests comparable, it is necessary to convert all results of the tests to scores on a common scale. The Star Early Literacy scale ranges from 300-900.

STAR Reading scaled scores range from 0 to 1400. All norm-referenced scores are derived from the scaled score. Percentile rank (PR) is a norm-referenced score that provides a measure of a student’s reading ability compared to other students in the same grade nationally.

WHAT DO THE CODES STAND FOR ON THE STAR REPORTS?

STAR Early Literacyand a strong prediction of proficiency as measured by STAR Readingin Grade 3. The minimum beginning-of-year kindergarten scale score associated with 70% mastery is 530. This score was identified to be the beginning-of-year kindergarten readiness benchmark (Renaissance Learning 2014).
