The Walcheren Campaign was an unsuccessful British expedition to the Netherlands in 1809 intended to open another front in the Austrian Empire's struggle with France during the War of the Fifth Coalition. Around 40,000 soldiers, 15,000 horses together with field artillery and two siege trains crossed the North Sea and landed at Walcheren on 30 July. Whatever the true cause, the Walcheren expedition was a disaster. With a large land force and overwhelming naval strength, the British achieved only a very limited success against French warships and dockyards. The French admitted to suffering financial losses of £2,000,000 but the expedition had cost the British at least £8,000,000.

The Walcheren Expedition of 1809 - The Waterloo Association

Over 4,000 British troops perished between 30 July and 9 December 1809, but only 106 died in combat. Initially, success was known. The British army met little French resistance and quickly set up encampments on the neighboring islands of Walcheren and South Beveland, both in present-day the Netherlands.
